DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Explanation of the Club Application Process (Appendix A), put forth by Muskaan Aggarwal (3 minutes)

Muskaan: I am going to start by explaining the process of club applications and the policies that guide clubs within (VUSAC) to answer any questions you might have. At VUSAC, we believe in fostering a vibrant and inclusive campus community through recognized clubs. Clubs play a pivotal role in providing opportunities for personal growth, creativity, and camaraderie among our diverse student body. To ensure a smooth and fair process, we have established clear guidelines for club recognition. First and foremost, any aspiring clubs were to submit their Club Application Form to the Vice-President Student Organizations (VPSO). This year, the primary application period was from June 21st to July 18th at 11:59 pm. This form was then carefully reviewed and the application will now be considered for ratification by the council, or throughout the school year, during the next appropriate VUSAC meeting, as long as the minimum requirements for recognition are met. Our recognition process extends annually, meaning that clubs must renew their recognition each year. Any recognition granted during the year will remain valid until the following April 30th. This ensures that our clubs remain up-to-date and aligned with the evolving needs of our community. To be recognized by VUSAC, clubs must fulfill several minimum requirements. They must have an executive team that adheres to our policies, a dedicated club email address, and a unique logo that represents their identity. Moreover, our clubs must faithfully follow the mission statement and mandate of VUSAC and provide accurate information on their Club Application Form. Furthermore, to ensure that all recognized clubs maintain transparency and accountability, they are now mandated to submit their up-to-date constitution to the VPSO which has been linked in the Appendix for all of your conveninece. This ensures that each club's mission and objectives align with VUSAC policies. To encourage inclusivity and flexibility, we allow clubs to request recognized status at any time, except during the period between April 30th and the opening of the following year's primary



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application period. This approach enables first-year students to form clubs and facilitates the creation of clubs after the budget request deadline. As we cherish diversity and representation, we require that a club's executive team must consist of University of Toronto students, with at least 70% of them being members of the Victoria College Union (VCU). Additionally, we encourage clubs to have two recognized Club Heads, where at least one must be a VCU member. Lastly, we believe in fostering a culture of equity and inclusion. As part of this commitment, all members of the club's executive team must attend VUSAC-approved Equity Training, ensuring that our clubs are safe, respectful, and inclusive spaces. In conclusion, VUSAC remains dedicated to empowering our student community through recognized clubs that celebrate creativity, diversity, and unity. I encouraged all aspiring clubs to embrace these guidelines as we worked together on refining the club applications and constitutions to create an enriching and inclusive campus experience for all. EXECUTIVE REPORTS:

VP Student Organization: Muskaan Aggarwal (3 minutes)

Muskaan: I just wanted to say thank you for ratifying all the clubs. I've been getting ready for getting these clubs for ratification today and working with new club heads for policies and constitutions. I also hosted a workshop which was a success – 3 people showed up! 23 club applications were received and 2 applications were incomplete. 2 applications were also submitted after the deadline so they won't be ratified this meeting but later in the Fall. I've been checking with the Levy heads and trying to switch all of them to credit unions. Shane and I had a meeting with UTSU execs in the last two weeks in time and eventually, I'm hoping to call all the organizations across campus to transition to a credit union to make it more centralized.

President: Shane Joy (5 minutes)

Shane: Just in accordance with our governing documents, I wanted to give an update on the motions that were passed during our emergency meeting which was held 2 weeks ago, on July 7th. At that meeting, we ratified minutes from the Winter Budget meeting from January 27th, our amendments to the Budget Steering Policy, our Equitable Hiring Policy, and the Elections



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and Referenda Dode - each of those documents are now available on the VUSAC website. I also have some results from email votes to announce. We ratified some budget lines from VCDS and Vic Black, as well as the yearly payment for the voting system next year which will be available on the website as well. I feel like VUSAC will be really strapped for cash this upcoming year and for this reason, Callan and I will be working on reporting in accordance with the governing documents, which reviews our honoraria, justifications for them in the context of funding. On elections. Dhir and I have done a test-election but we will be running more to ensure that VUSAC is absolutely ready for the Fall. I've received a list of students selected by the Dean's office to join the Election Appeals Committee which will be ratified to an email vote, hopefully in early August. I'm really thankful for Dhir again for the work he's continuing to do. More on the review that Vic Administration is undergoing with Campus Safety and preparedness that I mentioned, I met with the Dean of Victoria University, and we discussed some best ways to get feedback from students about these things. The best conclusion we came to in getting feedback is to essentially broaden the conversation and bringing more people to the table. We think that the best way is to hold consultations with different populations of students. This will include students that are randomly selected and students with more information such as equity groups on campus. The first meeting for that will most likely be in late summer or early September. Another thing I've been working on is the Okanagan Charter. We've been going over ways in which we think Vic is already meeting the calls to action as well as falling short. In my eyes, this will be a great win for student advocacy and will provide a great reference point for us to keep administrators accountable to their commitments. Moving forward, this is our last meeting of the summer, thank you to everyone. Massive thanks to Muskaan!
