Being the CRO for 2017-2018, I was privileged to be a part of the VUSAC team and to monitor the elections process. Below are the summaries for each respective time period.

# **Fall Elections:**

The Fall 2017 Elections took place from Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> to Tuesday, September 26<sup>th</sup>. The bi-elections had a total of 10 available positions as both the VP External and Sustainability Commissioner positions were not filled from the previous school year. Sixteen candidates ran for 10 positions; a total of 312 votes were cast and there were no appeals in the process.
